EIP-AGRI: context

- The EIP-AGRI has been established by the European Commission's Directorate General for Agriculture and Rural Development within the framework of Europe 2020 Strategy
- Europe 2020 flagship EIP as a tool to foster innovation
- Innovation as a key element to prepare EU for future challenges
- Innovation on technological, non-technological, organisational or social perspectives, based on new or traditional practices



EIP-AGRI: aims and objective

• Aims:

- Foster a competitive and sustainable agriculture and forestry sector,
- achieve "more and better from less",
- work in harmony with the environment,
- and ensure a steady supply of food, feed and biomaterials, in harmony with natural resources
- Main objective **bridging the gap** between research and farming practice, focussing on real, existing issues and research needs from the field



EIP-AGRI: areas

- Increased agricultural productivity, output and resource efficiency.
- Innovation in support of the bio-based economy.
- Biodiversity, ecosystem services and soil functionality.
- Innovative products and services for the integrated supply chain.
- Food quality, food safety and healthy lifestyles



EIP-AGRI: approach

- The EIP-AGRI will provide a working interface to facilitate communication on innovation and sharing of knowledge across Europe between agriculture, bioeconomy, science and other players at all levels: EU, national and regional.
- It acts based on an "interactive innovation model":
 - Focused on forming partnerships
 - Using bottom-up approaches
 - Link farmers, researchers, advisors, businesses, NGOs and other actors in a network —> The EIP Network

EIP-AGRI: who's who

- **High Level Steering Board** establishes general orientations and gives strategic advice; brings together 42 members, including MS representatives at ministerial level, farm and forestry organisations, environmental and consumer organisations, advisory services, agribusiness and scientists
- Directorate-General for Agriculture and Rural Development (DG AGRI) – Unit H.1: Environment, Genetic Resources and European Innovation Partnership
- Service Point (internacional consortium)
- **Operational Groups** (key acting entities)



EIP-AGRI: Service Point

- Established by the European Commission's Directorate General for Agriculture and Rural Development in April 2013
- Aimed to act as a **MEDIATOR** in enhancing communication and cooperation between all innovation actors
- Constituted by a **TEAM** of people from different nationalities, covering a wide range of expertise
- Headquartered in Brussels

The EIP AGRI Service Point acts as a mediator in enhancing communication and cooperation between all innovation actors, including farmers, advisors, agri-business, civil society, and researchers, working at EU, national and regional level



EIP-AGRI: Service Point tasks

Sharing knowledge

- Promote a flow of information and exchange of knowledge, interact with different actors, collect relevant information such as policy measures, research activities, funding opportunities, lessons learned from practice-oriented projects, other agricultural initiatives in the EU
- Actions: organise events (seminars, workshops), involve actors using mutiple communication channels (publications, newsletter, website, database, etc.)

Tackling challenges


- Facilitate knowledge sharing and search for innovative solutions to address key challenges, collect and give feedback on research needs from practice
- Actions: promote and facilitate the set up of Focus Groups on key issues, report and disseminate relevant findings

Connecting people

- Involve all types of key players that are agriculture-related and relevant to trigger the innovation process
- Actions: promote and facilitate seminars, workshops, organise Focus Groups, use social media and other means of communication
